4. News coverage
 - a. What is said about the service – good, bad, etc.
5. Highlights
 - a. Best shows/Notable programming (cost?)
 - b. Ratings/subscribers or some other metric of success or failure
 - c. Any issues or problems or game changing decisions?
 - i. Small Example: Disney+ crashed on Day 1, bet big on streaming and...
 - ii. Example: Max – day & date releases began in 2021, what's happened?
 - iii. Paramount+ - deal with South Park creators? 1883?
6. Most important elements to the service
7. Use the Industry, Institutions and Audiences aspect throughout.
 - a. What is the equation for this app?
8. Opinion:
 - a. Will the service survive? Why or why not?
 - b. Is it a good service? Worth the cost?
 - c. Should I spend my money on this service?
9. Feel free to explore other elements not covered.

Mandatory:

- Please put footnotes and sources on the slide with any information
 - *Sources: Wikipedia is not a source!*
- Use terms from the texts.
- Create a handout for subjects you didn't cover, didn't have time to cover.
 - Make it pretty if possible.
 - Maybe put the essentials that you don't want to waste time on.

Notes:

- You are judged individually and as a group. Work with or without each other.
- Split the work evenly amongst your group.
- Presentation should have a unifying flow and theme
- Rehearse and Time Your Work, Use Index cards.
